

CRITERIA FOR OFFICIATING 3-PERSON GAMES AND COLLEGE GAMES ASSIGNED BY THE NDBRA

To be eligible to officiate any 3-person game assigned by the NDBRA, all and any officials are required to attend one of the 3-person FIBA Technique clinics presented by the NDBRA. These clinics will be held after the OCTOBER and NOVEMBER General Meetings and will be based on 3-person FIBA Technique. Anybody interested in officiating the growing number of 3-person games is required to attend and stay until the end of the clinic, even if they are uncertain as to whether or not they will be assigned. Panel Members are exempt from these sessions, as they attend a camp prior to the season.

IN ADDITION, officials assigned to 3-person crews are to be IAABO members.

SPECIAL CRITERIA FOR ALL NIAGARA COLLEGE GAMES

To officiate any Niagara College game, or represent the NDBRA at any college tournament, the official must successfully complete the CABO-FIBA Rules test, be proficient in 3-person FIBA technique and hold IAABO membership. This allows the official to referee during the calendar year (January to December) following the test. Rules knowledge is important for all college games, thus attendance at one pre-season clinic (after the October or November meeting) is MANDATORY.

The official is to wear the NDBRA constitutionally-mandated uniform for this level of game.

During the calendar year prior to the CABO-FIBA rules test, officials will be evaluated. If applicable, the evaluator will especially consider an official's understanding of 3-person FIBA technique, as well as the application of the rules played by the league, if the evaluation occurs at a college assignment. The Assigning Officer will use the evaluations as input for future assignments.

Failure to fulfill any requirement will disqualify officials from officiating any 3-person and/or Niagara College game.
